

# College Acceptance Rates




Supply vs. Demand

- 2015 -20 million students in college
- 1965 to 2015, 240% college attendance increase
- -Most selective colleges, 5-10% chance of acceptance
- -Example: Stanford 2007 (10.3%) 2017 (4.7%)








# What is the national college graduation rate in four years at a public university?








# **Typical Cost and Resources**




# How many of you believe that the cost of education is indicative of quality?



# Cost vs. Selectivity


Fewer Americans believe cost is indicative of quality


- Budgeting




# How many of you agree that college is an important investment for the future?

#### Unemployment rates and earnings by educational attainment, 2016



# What Parents can do to help...


- Instill belief in degree expectation

- · Try to keep pride and vanity out of the decision








